	<i>Developments in Construction Law (2015)</i> This year three CA cases would be reviewed. The first case reminds all of us to take precaution in avoiding being liable for our independent contractor's negligence liability. The second case examines what appears to be the start of a new trend to limit Singapore's position of granting an injunction against a call of the bond because of unconscionability by way of a contractual clause. The third case warns of the pit falls in the reliance of terms like market and market value/price in the valuation of variation clauses. This would be followed by a review of 6 High Court cases touching on areas like Negligence and WSHA; Termination; Challenges against successful restraining the call of an on-demand bond; Confidentiality of drawings; Scope of indemnity clause; and payment dispute with an overview on the yet-to-be implemented design for safety regulations.
