About this Seminar:

Although this presentation will focus on NEC3 (and the more recent NEC4), the collaborative/cooperative mechanisms referred to can be incorporated into traditional forms of contract to make them more effective in terms of proactive risk management and avoidance/mitigation of what would otherwise be time and cost overruns. In particular, the importance of having an agreement between the contracting parties to work together to identify, mitigate and compensate for risk events in a proactive and business like manner will ensure that their respective obligations under the Contract can be fulfilled. The presentation will also include the recent adoption by NEC4 of dispute avoidance systems used by contracts such as FIDIC to underpin the effectiveness of mandatory cooperation under NEC.
